Rob is a product of Santa Ana School system and is now Vice President, Board of Education, Santa Ana Unified School District.

Prior he held many positions of leadership in Santa Ana, including Council Member, so is keenly aware of the importance of education and the impact it can have on a Santa Ana.

Rob is also active in the community and members of Kiwanis Club of Santa Ana. He has been honored for his service and shared the funny story of where and how he was recognized.

As a member of the Board, he applies basic business principles to ensure that money is spent wisely and they can account for monies spent or invested.

Given public money, they must know what they are spending, and why they are buying something. He referenced an example of why so important and the important fiduciary role and responsibility the Board has to the community and the 56,000 children that need a strong education to be prepared for college and career.

Results: Going for the Green

Currently 44 schools are in the green with strong results showing for elementary but not for HS level, which may be attributable to the fairly recent changes such as single curriculum adoption and school upgrades and new programs.



Moving Forward

Currently, there's a \$20.3M deficit. The district is underfunded by the State of California. SAUSD approached crisis in in a different way and tried to avoid furloughs and other such cuts as long as possible. He provided a Measure G update. They are also changing campuses to K-8 (vs K-5). Encourage Positive Behavior Intervention (incentives). They have invested in teacher training to help low performing schools.
